What is a Dandelion?

Have you ever seen a fluffy white ball floating through the air?
That's a dandelion seed head!
Before it looks like that, it's a bright yellow flower. Dandelions are special because they can grow almost anywhere – in your

garden, a park, or even a crack in the pavement!

Dandelion's Amazing Life Cycle

A dandelion starts its life as a tiny seed. When the seed lands in the right place, it grows a root and then a green leaf. Lots of leaves grow together to make a rosette, which looks a bit like a star. Soon, a tall green stem grows in the middle of the rosette. At the top of the stem, a beautiful yellow flower blooms.

After the flower dies, it turns into a fluffy white ball. This is called a seed head. When the wind blows, the seeds fly away and start new dandelion plants.



A Flower and a Friend

Dandelions are important for lots of creatures. Bees and butterflies love to drink the sweet nectar from the yellow flowers. Birds eat

the seeds. Even some people like to eat dandelion leaves in salads!



But dandelions can also be a bit tricky. They have long roots that can be hard to pull out, and they can grow quickly. That's why some people think of them as weeds. But remember, every plant has a purpose, and dandelions are part of nature's amazing world.

- Dandelion leaves can be used to make a delicious tea.
- The word dandelion comes from the French words 'dent de lion', which means 'lion's tooth'.
- Dandelion blossoms can be used to make a pale yellow dye.
- The entire plant leaves, stems, flowers, and roots is edible.
